SEMINAR OVERVIEW

HIGHER EDUCATION TRENDS: DESIGN, CONSTRUCTION AND HIGHER EDUCATION DEVELOPMENT

Our Higher Education seminar will focus on an in-depth case study of CUNY/CCNY's Advanced Sciences Research Center. Together with Skanska, the Dormitory Authority of the State of New York and Flad Architects, CUNY and CCNY are undertaking a \$600 million, 400,000 SF new construction project. The complex consists of two buildings: the CCNY Science Facility and the Advanced Science Research Center (ASRC) constructed over a shared ground floor. The 149,000 SF CCNY Science Facility building provides space for state-of-the-art research and teaching laboratories in the areas of biology, chemistry and physics. The ASRC building will be approximately 136,000 SF and contain research and development labs, a cafe and an auditorium. The four and five-story, steel-framed, curtain wall, stone and metal panel clad buildings have a 115,000 shared ground floor below a plaza housing imaging facilities, a clean room, a vivarium and mechanical areas. A future 200,000 SF ASRC Phase 2 has already been excavated as part of this project.

The seminar will feature presentations from Skanska, CUNY, DASNY and Flad Architects, who will discuss the vision behind the project, as well as past and anticipated challenges.
