Pat Di Filippo Elected to National Academy of Construction

Austin, TX — The National Academy of Construction has elected Pat Di Filippo, executive vice president of Turner Construction Company, as a member of its class of 2022. He will be formally inducted October 6 during the NAC Construction Hall of Fame Gala in Scottsdale, AZ.

In electing Di Filippo, NAC cited him as a “strategic leader in major construction operations and in iconic projects and a strong advocate for work force development and women in the construction trades.”

Wayne Crew, president and CEO of the Academy, said, “Our 2022 class represents dedication to the industry and significant contributions to improving the built environment. Pat Di Filippo’s advocacy for opening up opportunities to diversify the work force and for excellence in iconic construction projects have had incredible impact. We welcome him.”

Election criteria for NAC includes leadership, exceptional service, a continued commitment to making a contribution, past recognition by peers for innovation, and being recognized as “best of the best.” The NAC Class of 2022 members is composed of 34 industry practitioners from various sectors of the industry: academics, researchers, owners, contractors, designers, lawyers, and consultants. Election to the Academy is one way to honor members’ contributions over a career, and also provides members with a chance to give back to both the industry and the nation through their NAC participation. The Academy has now inducted over 400 industry leaders since its founding in 1999.

Di Filippo provides strategic, operational, and institutional leadership and is responsible for Turner’s construction operations in New York, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Connecticut, Massachusetts, and the New England states. He has been associated with many notable projects, including Hearst Tower, Yankee Stadium, the World Trade Center reconstruction, Madison Square Garden Transformation, Children’s Hospital of Philadelphia, Lincoln Center, Jacob K. Javits Convention Center Expansion, and La Guardia and JFK airport expansions. He is active in the Contractors Association of Greater New York and the Building Trades Employers Association, and chairs the Non-Traditional Employment for Woman (NEW), a leading NYC work force development organization for women in the trades. He also serves on the board of the NYC Construction Industry Safety Council and on the Rutgers College of Engineering Industry Advisory Board. He earned a bachelor’s degree in civil engineering with a specialization in construction engineering and structures from Rutgers University.
